LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Teaching Language	At the Bachelor level, almost all courses are taught in French. A good command of French is required (level B2) and must be certified, either with a certificate from an acknowledged examiner (DELF B2, etc.) or by the sending institution.
Language Courses	Intensive French classes take place during the integration week (see below). French classes can also be attended during the semester. Upon passing the exam, 2 ECTS credits will be awarded. Those credits can be included in the Learning Agreement.

GRANTS

Exchange students from a partner university may receive a grant from the Swiss government and/or the UAS Western Switzerland. The amount of the grant depends of the country of origin.
